Dreamworld rides, attractions, entertainment, activities and facilities	Exposure to sun	Sunburn	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> A large number of shaded areas are provided throughout the parks Sunscreen and hats are provided for sale at retail outlets Health Care facilities are provided on site for treatment of sunburn 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> It is recommended that schools enforce the mandatory wearing of hats, collared shirts and sunscreen
		Dehydration	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Water coolers are provide for general use throughout parks Bottled water is available for sale at food & beverage outlets and vending machines 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> It is recommended that students bring a water bottle and refill it regularly throughout the day
	Use of rides and attractions	Injury emanating from not complying with safety procedures	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Each ride / attraction specifies defined safety procedures on signage located at the entry These procedures are again reinforced in a verbal message prior to the ride commencing Any visitor not conforming to the procedures will be asked to leave the ride 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> For students with known medical conditions, it is recommended that the school consult with Dreamworld regarding which rides / attractions will not be viable

	General emergency (fire, medical etc.)	Injury emanating from emergency	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A highly structured emergency system exists at Dreamworld which includes emergency teams, codes, procedures and resources • During an emergency, any visitor who is given an instruction by Dreamworld staff are required to follow it 	
	Student becomes detached from group	Lost child becomes distressed	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A “lost children” procedure is enacted during such circumstances. This involves the carrying out of strategic searches for children within the park 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Schools are advised to nominate a central location within the park where lost students will meet if they become detached
	Rain / wet weather	Injury emanating from slips	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All walkways, stairs and ride entrances meet Australian Standards for anti-slip resistance. • Guests seen running at any time will be asked to stop and walk 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Schools can assist with the enforcing of a no run policy and wearing of fully enclosed shoes with adequate grip
